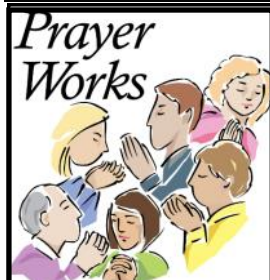

Marguerite Ritzinger Scholarship

Applications for the Marguerite Ritzinger Scholarship of the Diocese of Davenport are being accepted now through February 27, 2026. Catholic individuals who plan to attend a college or university next fall may apply for a \$1,000 scholarship. Nontraditional students may apply for the scholarships. The award is named for the late Marguerite Ritzinger, a Sigourney native, who left \$388,770 to the diocese to help with scholarships for seminarians and students attending colleges or universities.

Applications must include an essay, copy of a high school or college transcript and two reference letters. All items must be sent together with the application form, which is available on the diocesan website at <https://www.davenportdiocese.org/finance-library>.

The collection on Ash Wednesday will go to aid the Churches of Central and Eastern Europe.

Ash Wednesday and Good Friday are obligatory days of fasting and abstinence for Catholics. In addition, Fridays during Lent are obligatory days of abstinence. For members of the Catholic Church, the norms on fasting are obligatory from age 18 until age 59. When fasting, a person is permitted to eat one full meal, as well as two smaller meals that together are not equal to a full meal. The norms concerning abstinence from meat are binding upon members of the Catholic Church from age 14 onwards.

Holy Hour for Peace and Justice

Bishop Walsh has asked every parish to have several Holy Hours for Peace and Justice during Lent. As Bishop Walsh states in his letter, "*Archbishop Paul S. Coakley, President of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops, has recommended that our dioceses offer a Holy Hour for Peace and Justice. In light of the extraordinary political upheaval and tension currently fracturing our communities, our families, and even the body of the Church itself, I believe this is not just a recommendation, but a spiritual necessity.*"

We find ourselves in a moment where it is increasingly difficult to discern what is true. Our daily lives are inundated with ideological narratives and political theater that often obscure the Gospel. This atmosphere of division breeds mistrust and distance between us."

Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time Righteous Stewards

“For I tell you, unless your righteousness exceeds that of the scribes and Pharisees, you will never enter the kingdom of heaven.” MATTHEW 5:20

The Pharisees lived according to the letter of the law, not Stewardship. They used this to elevate themselves above the other people. Jesus is clear – it’s the love that you have in your heart, for God and others, that will get you to heaven. Simply following church rules to the letter and not out of love, does not necessarily put you on the path to heaven.
